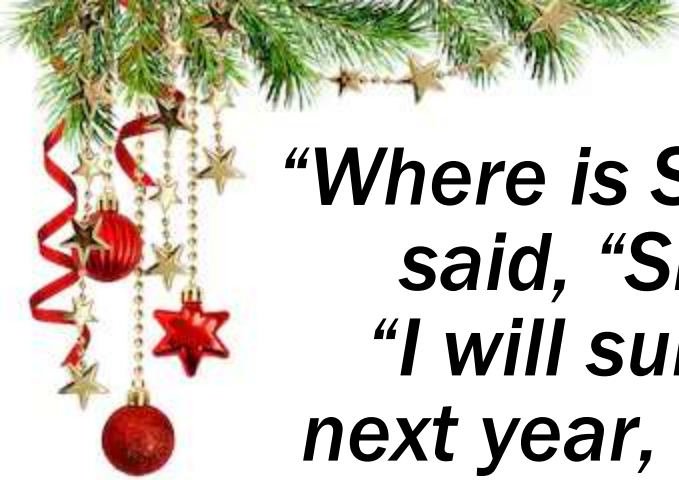
Genesis 17:15-16

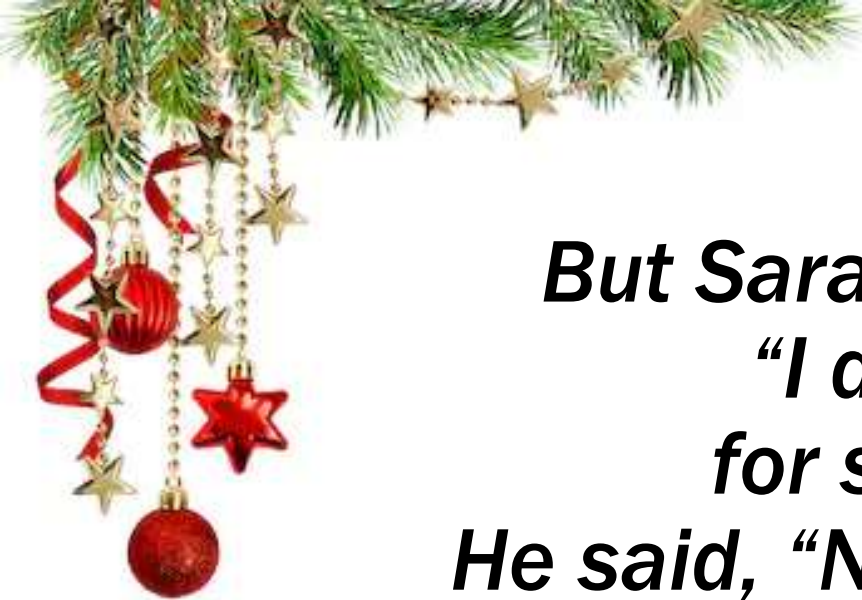

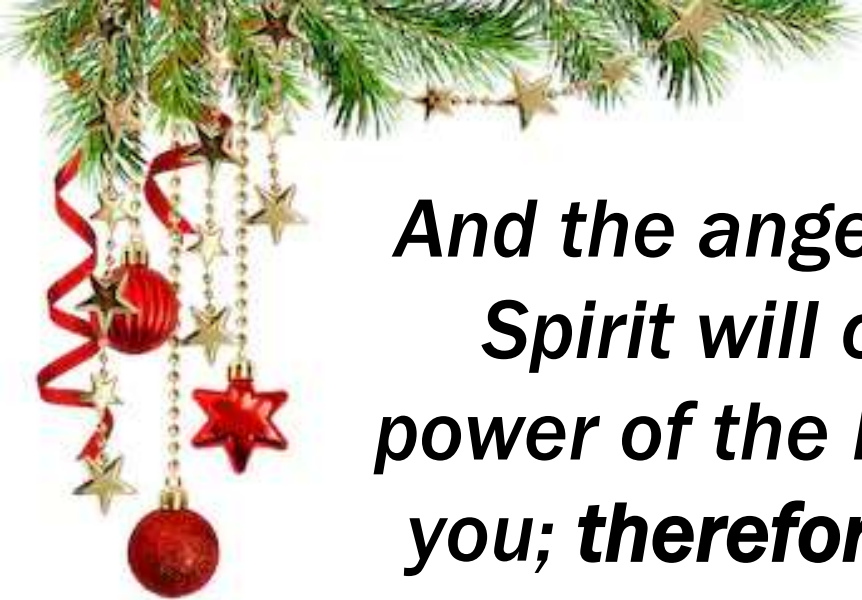

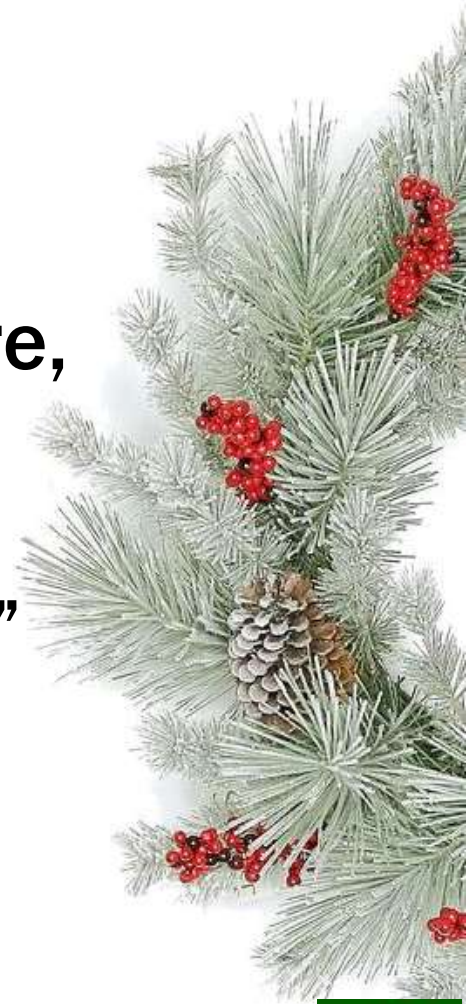
2 Corinthians 8:9
