Acts 7:22

And Moses was instructed in all the wisdom of the Egyptians, and he was mighty in his words and deeds.



when Moses had grown up, he went to <u>his</u> <u>people</u> and <u>looked on</u> their burdens, and he saw an Egyptian beating a Hebrew, one of <u>his people</u>.



Hebrews 11:24-25

²⁴ By faith Moses, when he was grown up, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter, ²⁵ choosing rather to be mistreated with the people of God than to enjoy the fleeting pleasures of sin.



<u>He looked this way and that, and seeing no</u> <u>one</u>, he struck down the Egyptian and hid him in the sand.



Acts 7:25

He supposed that his brothers would understand that God was giving them salvation by his hand, but they did not understand.



Do not put your trust in your own strength; put your trust in God.

Exodus 2:23-25

²³ During those many days the king of Egypt died, and the people of Israel groaned because of their slavery and cried out for help. Their cry for rescue from slavery came up to God. ²⁴ And <u>God heard</u> their groaning, and God remembered his covenant with Abraham, with Isaac, and with Jacob. ²⁵ God saw the people of Israel-and God knew.



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Philippians 2:6-8

⁶ who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, ⁷ but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men.⁸ And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.



Philippians 2:9-11

⁹ Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, ¹⁰ so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, ¹¹ and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.
