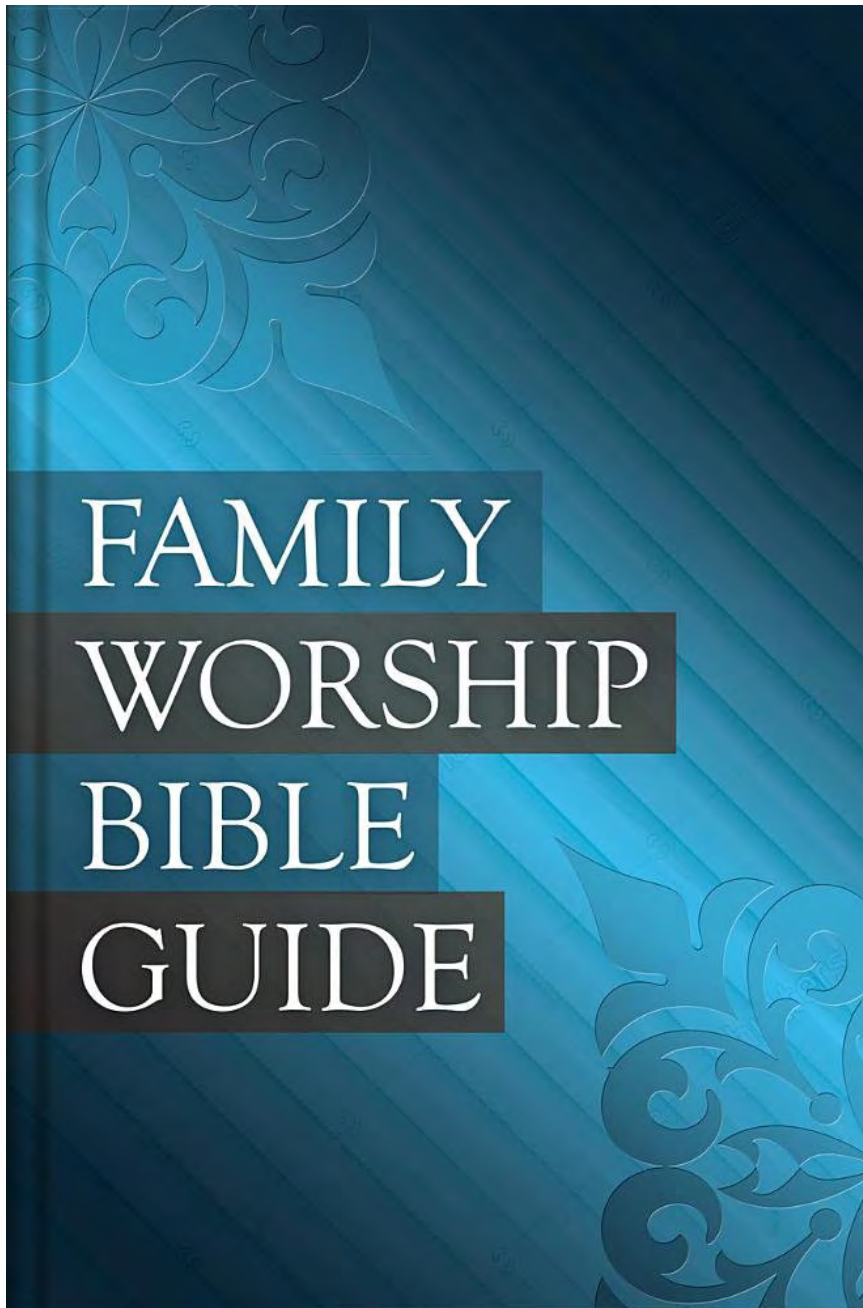

Dear Agapian,

It's Yours!

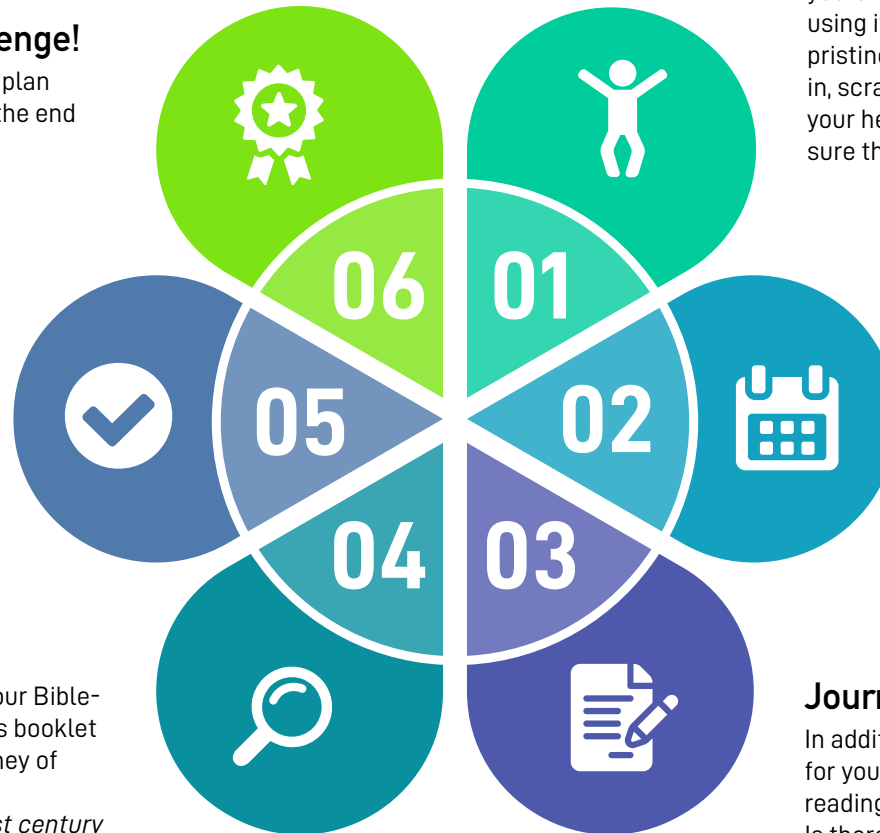

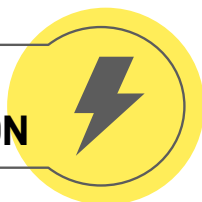

4 QUESTIONS ON APPLICATION

3 What does God want me to desire?

"This question targets the affections—the combination of desires, inclinations, feelings, and will that are the spring of our actions. God calls us to desire Him above all else, but apart from the work of the gospel we will desire what's evil. Reflect on how you see the sinful desires mentioned or implied in the passage show up in your own life, as well as the kind of godly desires you should be cultivating."

2. What does God want me to believe?
3. What does God want me to desire?

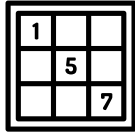

Tips for Graphing Along

Spot the patterns. Divide and conquer.

1 Remember the Abrahamic Covenant

God promised Abraham land, descendants, relationship with God, and blessing to the nations. How is God fulfilling these promises?

2 Move with the People

The book of Numbers alternates between lists and collections of laws, and the narrative of the Israelites' journey. Are you rushing ahead of the story?

3 Follow Moses

We are given a behind-the-scenes look at Moses' journey as a mediator. What kind of leader was he? What does it look like to mediate between God and people? How would Moses' journey end?

4 Compare the Generations

What do you learn about the patterns of the exodus generation? How does God raise up the newer generation? What warnings can you take to heart? What encouragements?

GUARDING THE GOSPEL:

Get behind Galatians!

Galatians is an epistle (or 'letter') written by the apostle Paul. As the title indicates, Galatians was written to the Galatian Christians.



What's an Epistle?

Easily ¾ of the books in the New Testament are epistles – but be warned: *Epistles do not read like storybooks!* Epistles are instructive: truths to believe (indicatives) and corresponding commands to fulfil (imperatives).



Crisis!

The Galatian Christians were being brought into slavery under the law. False teachers had infiltrated the church, and had deceived the Christians. They taught that believing in Jesus was only the first step. Instead, they taught that the true essence of the faith is found in circumcision and a commitment to follow the law of Moses.

Who was lying? What is the true Christian faith?



Guiding Questions

Paul is at a disadvantage. He's writing from far away but the false teachers can speak directly into the ears of the Galatians. As Paul writes, he anticipates the doubts and confusions that are on the hearts of the believers – and he addresses them! Here are the broad questions Paul addresses:

- 1 *Is Paul the false teacher (1:6–2:21)?*
- 2 *Does God respond to faith or to the keeping of the law (3–4)? What role does the law play with respect to sin (5:20; 7:1–25)?*
- 3 *How then do we live the Christian life (5:1–6:10)?*
- 4 *If not circumcision – then what (6:11–6:18)?*

Galatians is Paul's single-minded defense of the free gift of the gospel! Read on to see how he pits faith against works, law against grace, liberty against legalism, sonship against slavery, and the fruit of the Spirit against the desires of the flesh.

Grasp God's grace permeating all of Galatians!

ELEVATING THE GOSPEL:

Eclipsed by Ephesians!

Ephesians is an epistle by Paul,
written to the believers in Ephesus.

No problem?

Paul's epistles are usually written to a particular people to address a particular issue. However, here in Ephesians, no specific problem is raised! Instead Paul goes deeper into the truths of the gospel – God's redemptive work in Christ, the unity of the church, and applying the gospel to everyday matters.

A letter of Two Halves

Ephesians is split almost perfectly in half! The first half is almost entirely an explanation of the gospel, while the second half is almost nothing but the application of the gospel!



Main Themes

Paul's letter is packed with various themes:

- 1 *Blessedness in Christ (1:3-14)*
- 2 *Prayer (1:15-23; 3:14-21)*
- 3 *Saved by faith through grace (2:1-10)*
- 4 *Unity (2:11-22; 4:1-16)*
- 5 *God's mysterious plan for the Gentiles (3:1-13)*
- 6 *New life (4:17-32)*
- 7 *Love (5:1-6:9)*
- 8 *The Armour of God (6:10-20)*

*There is more gospel per square inch in Ephesians
than in anywhere else in the Bible!*

Even so, go slow; savour every square inch!

Filled by Philippians!

Philippians, an epistle written by the apostle Paul to the believers in Philippi.



An Unusual Letter

The Philippian believers held a special place in Paul's heart. He lavishes them with unusual love (4:1). He uses words like 'joy' and 'rejoice' some 16 times in this short letter. Rather than being a letter correcting or rebuking, Paul seems to have written a 'thank you' letter.



Christ-Filled

Paul unceasingly calls the focus to Christ:

Chapter 1

Christ is LIFE

Chapter 2

Christ is EXAMPLE

Chapter 3

Christ is HOPE

Chapter 4

Christ is the SOURCE



Power-Packed

Philippians is also jam-packed with famous, heart-gripping verses:

1:6 "...he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion..."

1:21 "For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain."

2:5-11 Christ's humility and exaltation

2:12 "...work out your own salvation with fear and trembling"

3:7 "But whatever gain I had, I counted as loss for the sake of Christ."

3:14 "I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus."

4:4 "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice."

4:7 "And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts..."

4:13 "I can do all things through him who strengthens me."

Philippians is indispensable to Christian maturity! Whether in plenty or in suffering, here Paul unveils the secret to rejoicing –
I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me!

DOUBLE-DOWN:

Durable Deuteronomy

The people of Israel are back at the edge of the promised land. The 40 years of wandering has ended. Very soon, Joshua would lead a new generation to take the land. Moses, the last of the previous generation, presents his final words...

It Endures!

The book of Deuteronomy is quoted throughout much of the Bible! It is the basis for the story from Joshua to Kings.

Often, the prophets would interpret the times based on the covenant blessings and curses found in Deuteronomy.

In the New Testament, Jesus quotes from Deuteronomy more than any other book. The Apostle Paul often features passages from Deuteronomy in his writing – especially in the book of Romans. *What an enduring book!*



The Demand of Total Obedience

More than any other book in the Old Testament, Deuteronomy demands total obedience to God's will! How are we to respond to such an intense call today?

1 See God's character revealed in His Law

God's commands are not random! They reflect who He is and what He values.

2 Apply the principles

The letter of the Law is no longer binding upon the Christian. Yet, the spirit of the Law provides guiding principles for the Christian life!

3 Not tomorrow – submit today!

The word "today" appears 48 times in this book. God is calling us to respond today!

Survival Pack

It's easy to be daunted by Deuteronomy – here's a lifeline!

I Prologue (1:1-5)

II Moses' First Speech: Keep the Law (1:6-4:43)

III Moses' Second Speech: Allegiance to the LORD is Top Priority (4:44-28:68)

IV Moses' Third Speech: Covenant confirmation, blessings and curses (29-30)

V Succession Plan (31-32)

VI Blessing and Burial (33-34)

Deuteronomy reveals that the greatest threat to God's project for the world is not the Egyptians or the Canaanites! It is the human heart.

Be humbled – and let your heart ache for the Saviour!

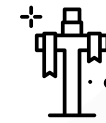

CHRIST IS LORD:

Incomparable Colossians!

Paul wrote Colossians as an epistle to the Christians in Colossae.



Big Problem

The church in Colossae was not facing obvious problems. In fact, they appeared to be doing well! But a crisis was brewing – it wasn't an obvious problem, but it was a *big* one. False teaching was leading people to doubt Christ's supremacy and His sufficiency to grant salvation.



Letter Outline

Colossians is a deceptively short letter – here's an outline to help you pay closer attention!

- 1 Greetings, Thanksgiving, Prayer (1:1-14)
- 2 Praise to Christ (1:15-23)
- 3 Paul's Labour (1:24-2:3)
- 4 Dangerous Teachings (2:4-23)
- 5 Christ: The True Focus (3:1-4)
- 6 Christian Living (3:5-4:6)
- 7 Personal Greetings and Closing (4:7-18)



Christ, Christ, Christ!

This word occurs numerous times in the book of Colossians. Here are some questions worth asking as we consider the importance of Christ to the book of Colossians:

- Who is Christ?
- What is His relationship with heavenly beings?
- What is His relationship with creation?
- What role does He play in salvation?
- What is His relationship with His church?
- What is His role in us becoming spiritually mature?

With over 70 references to Christ, you cannot help but meet Christ –
He is Supreme! He is Sufficient!



CRISISPOINT:

1 Body, 1 Corinthians

1 Corinthians is actually Paul's second letter (7:1) to the church in Corinth. It would not be his last...



A Troubled Church

The Corinthian church was rife with conflicts:

- 1 Division over leadership (1:10-4:21)
- 2 Lawsuits among believers (6:1-11)
- 3 Taking of the Lord's Supper (11:17-34)
- 4 Ranking of spiritual gifts (12-14)



A Flickering Light

Corinthian believers were also destroying their witness through cultural compromise:

- 1 Incest (5)
- 2 Sexual immorality (6:12-20)
- 3 Marital issues (7:1-24)
- 4 Regarding singleness (7:25-40)
- 5 Dining in pagan temples (8:1-11:1)
- 6 Head coverings (11:2-16)
- 7 Rejecting the resurrection (15)



Jesus Christ and Him Crucified!

But when dealing with each issue, Paul almost always turns the focus back on Christ:

- 1 Divisions & Rivalry? *Christ crucified is the stumbling block - and the Church's one foundation*
- 2 Incest? *Christ is the Passover Lamb whom we celebrate without the old leaven*
- 3 Lawsuits? *We are all washed in the Name of Jesus and His Spirit*
- 4 Sexual immorality? *We were bought at the price of the crucified Christ*
- 5 Stumbling other believers? *Christ died for them*
- 6 Dining in pagan temples? *Ours is the supper of Christ's body and blood*
- 7 Inequality at the Lord's Supper? *We proclaim the Lord's death*

Christ is truly a Saviour – *our* Saviour!

Big problems, small problems, multiple problems, practical problems, doctrinal problems – in all these things, 1 Corinthians declares,
"Christ is always the answer!"
