The pain of abandonment cuts deep into ones soul - growing up feeling less than deserving, always fending for your own survival, trying different means to numb out the reminder of your very existence.

This is the reality of the majority that we have met in Uttaradit. Fathers are missing as they leave to work in another province, children are left alone as they drown in the pressures of social media, teens are exposed to vices and early pregnancy, infants disposed to the care of grandparents, and the cycle continues.

My heart aches with heaviness and compassion towards them. How I long for them to know and experience the love and acceptance from God, our Father, He who redeems and adopts us to be His beloved. He has not forgotten them. He sees and hears and longs for them to enter His kingdom. I ask that you pray alongside us for the hearts of the locals and for the deep heart work to be done. May they experience the Kingdom of God in their lives.

Updates on Farm Project

The initial plan for the Maesa farm project was to have Sorn's parents involved in the overall construction and management. This farm is to

serve as our self-sustainability avenue for the support of ministry funds. However, Sorn's father was recently appointed as an elder of the church and is currently going through transition as he adapts to the new role in the village.



With the construction of Maesa Farm delayed, we have decided to move the F.A.I.T.H (Food Always In The House) project to the family's backyard, by extending the existing plot of crops. This will serve as our testing ground for rural families to produce adequate nutritious vegetables all year round with minimal costs, labour, and land space.
