

## **Sermon Notes from 23 December**

## The Promise Delivered (Luke 2:22-35)

v22 Jesus came as promised, but as a child! He was brought to the temple 8 days after a 33-day period of purification for the mother.

1. The Unexpected Promise Delivered Lk 2:19 Though the grandeur and excitement of Christ's birth had passed, Mary still marveled at what was being said about the child (v33).

vv22-24 The one who carried the sins of the world did not come as a mighty warrior ready for vengeance but as a helpless infant, totally dependent on Joseph and Mary. *Why?* 

v26 Simeon, prompted by the Spirit, went to the temple to see the promised Saviour, but sees the child and breaks into a song (vv30-31). Why did Jesus come as a child? There is no other like Jesus! He is the only *bridge* between man and God for he alone is fully human and fully divine at the same time! He is not a product of this world, but conceived by the Holy Spirit. Hence, we get to be reconciled to God the Father. The virgin birth is the sign of His divinity. His infancy is the sign of His humanity. Jesus faced all the temptations that we face but remained pure, perfect and holy. To make the full sacrifice on our behalf, lesus had to make the full commitment.

v52 After 30 years of obscurity, Jesus quietly began a ministry that changed human history. He took the full burden and journey of humanity.

If Jesus had been God only, his sacrifice would have been cheap and

unconvincing. If Jesus had been man only, his sacrifice would have had no power; he would have been a martyr like thousand others. Jesus is the promised Messiah (Isa 7:14; Gal 4:4-5)!

## 2. The Promise Expectantly Received What made Simeon ready to receive the promised Messiah?

Lk 2:25-32 Simeon was a righteous and devout man of God. His posture of waiting expectantly for the promised consolation, meaning comfort (Isa 7) of Israel, prepared him as did Joseph of Arimathea (Mk 15:43). God prepares a person to receive Christ by stirring up a longing for consolation and salvation in their hearts. "Though I lived as a monk without reproach, I felt that I was a sinner before God with extremely disturbed conscience... At last, by the mercy of God, ... I began to understand that... the righteousness of God is revealed by the gospel... Here I felt that I was altogether born again and had entered paradise itself through open gates." Martin Luther

Simeon found the comfort (Isa 40:1-2) when Christ was born (Lk 2:30-32).

God wants you to experience His redemptive power at work in your life through a longing and stirring in your heart that can only be satisfied by Jesus.

## **Application**

Ask God to reveal to you the people in your circles of contact whose hearts He is preparing to receive Him. Be bold to invite them to church.
